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Word of the Day – Cursory

Hi everyone. Today's word of the day is **cursory**. **Cursory** means to do something hasty, to do something quickly without careful attention to detail.

Cursory is often paired with the word "glance". And we can say "cursory glance". A cursory glance is usually referring to looking at something quickly. Glance is a quick look for maybe a second so we can describe the way we're reading or the way that we're doing something by saying, "We gave it a cursory glance. We didn't read through thoroughly."

So cursory is opposite of thorough. We can use it in this example,

"Tom gave a <u>cursory</u> glance at the news this morning and he knew only that there was a bomb threat in the subway but if he had read more carefully he would have also known that the subway was shutdown this morning."
