

Word of the Day – **Dismissive**

Transcript

Hi everyone, it's Paul again and today's word of the day is **dismissive**. **Dismissive** is an adjective and it means lacking interest or indicating rejection. So, there's two ways you can use this. One is with your job. You can say for example,

"I told my boss my new idea but he was dismissive. He was dismissive of my idea."

So this means you told your boss your new idea but he didn't like it or immediately rejected it. Or you can say something like this,

"My boss never listens to me and he is dismissive of anything I say."

Another way you can use it is in your personal life. In your personal life you can say something like this,

"I told my girlfriend that I wanted to live in the US but she was dismissive of the idea."

So meaning that his girlfriend did not like the idea that he was going to the US and immediately rejected it. Or most students say this,

"My parents are always dismissive whenever I tell them I want to become an artist instead of a doctor."

So if you tell your parents that you want to be an artist they'll usually say you should rather be a doctor. So remember, **dismissive** means a person does not care what you are saying and disagrees with your idea. So I hope you understand what **dismissive** is.
