Word of the Day – **Succinct**

Transcript

Hi. The word of the day today is **succinct**. **Succinct** is an adjective. **Succinct** can be used to describe a person that speaks in brief with no excess of words. This is unlike someone who is verbose. You could also use this word to describe something that is short and to the point, like a synopsis in a written report. For example you could say when describing someone who is succinct,

"I cannot get a sense of his opinion on the matter. His answer was so succinct, he was hard to read."

So in this sentence, **succinct** is someone who is not very forthcoming with information so you don't have a sense where he stands either way. You could also use this word when describing when you perhaps have not enough time for a test. You could say,

"There was no time to write as much as I would have liked. There were so many questions that I had to answer them <u>succinctly</u> in the given allotted time."

So in this instance the word is describing something where you are short on time and if you had more time you would write more but given the breath of time, you had to write **succinctly**.
