Hi everyone. Today's word of the day is **elusive**. **Elusive** is an adjective. It has a slightly negative connotation. You can use it in a formal situation or in casual conversations. The definition of **elusive** is to describe someone or something that is hard to catch or tricky. It can also be used to describe ideas that are puzzling or hard to clearly understand.

You may hear it often used to describe criminals who are very hard to catch and keep escaping from the police. For example,

“That guy who robbed the bank last week escaped police custody again, and no one can find him. He slipped through their fingers. He’s very elusive.”

Or, you can use it to describe very rare animals; especially ones that people are not very sure are real. For example,

“Both the Sasquatch and the Loch Ness Monster are both elusive mystical creatures that some people still believe in but cannot seem to find.”
