Hi everyone. This is Paul. Today's word of the day is **juggle**. Now **juggle** is a verb and it's used informally, positively or negatively. Now the definition of juggle is to keep several objects in the air by throwing or catching them continuously, like you're **juggling balls**. So usually this is an act by people who are performing or clowns at a circus. But usually we use it informally when we're describing when someone is trying to do lots of things at the same time.

"For a mother, it's difficult to juggle raising children, working at a job, and being a wife."

So what we're trying to say here, mothers raise children, work at a job, and have to be a wife at the same time. Another way you can use **juggle** is,

"I have to juggle many responsibilities at work including writing reports, meeting clients, and traveling."

And my last example is,

"You need to stop juggling three women or you're going to be in big trouble."
