Word of the Day – **Revoke**

Hi everyone. Today's word of the day is **revoke**. **Revoke** is a verb and it's used formally and in a negative connotation. And the direct meaning of **revoke** means to take back or withdraw, annul, cancel, or reverse, rescind or repeal. So let's see an example,

"After the police caught the drunk driver, he went to jail then had to go to court. The judge revoked his license for one year."

So in this sense, you are trying to say that the judge took away or canceled his license for one year. Another way you can use it is in business,

"I apologize but I will be revoking my offer to sell the company as I have decided not to retire"
