Q: Why are men expected to pay for every date?

A:

1. First, it's not true that men pay for every date. It might have been true for older generations, but most young couples now share the cost for a date. I guess this age-old habit has to do with women's economic status in Korean in the past. It wasn't common for women to have a job and be economically independent, and it might have been men who picked up the tab. But now, gender equality is also an important issue when a man and a woman are dating.

2. Although many Koreans believe in gender equality, many people, especially women, still expect men to take care of most of the costs for a date. It's unfair for both men and women. When two independent individuals are in a relationship, they have to be economically independent as well. Don't you think it's hypocritical for women who are conscious of a women's right to be economically dependent on men?

3. There are some women who believe that men should pay on a date, but such women take up only a small portion of the female population. The story of hypocritical women emphasizing gender equality but economically dependent on men is a bit exaggerated. Many women believe it's proper that men and women should share the cost when they are in a relationship. Let's not overgeneralize the issue. It's a rare example of a limited number of cases.
